## Climate Change Working Group History

- A working group of the U.S. Coral Reef Task Force, established in 2007 under Resolution 18.1: Coral Reefs and Climate Change
- 54 members from 9 federal and 6 jurisdictional agencies,
   Pacific Islands Climate Change Cooperative and All Islands
   Coral Reef Committee
- Activities developed and reported at 7 workshops, 2007-2014

## Climate Change Working Group Current

- Resolution 28.2: Renewed Call to Action, 2012, mandates:
  - ✓ Recognize climate change as an underlying context of all USCRTF activities
  - ✓ Enhance engagement and collaboration to address impacts of climate change
  - Develop advanced methods, tools, and capacity to assess vulnerability and test adaptation planning frameworks and other tools
  - Expand and coordinate education and outreach efforts
  - ✓ Increase coordination and collaboration with other regional and international climate change initiatives
